Leadership for Environment and Development (LEAD) is a not-for-profit organization committed to promote change towards economically sustainable, socially equitable and environmentally responsible development.

The LEAD program was established with support from the Rockefeller Foundation in the wake of the United Nations Convention on Environment and Development in 1992. Its aim was to bring to life the message of Rio Declaration: to ensure that sustainable development, a relatively novel idea then, became integrated in the development culture and practice.

LEAD Pakistan was established in 1995. It incorporated an innovative capacity building program designed to provide knowledge, awareness, skills, exposure and linkages to leaders of tomorrow, in order for them to integrate sustainable development concerns in their work.

The program engages with senior and middle level managers representing the corporate, public and business sectors, as well as the media, academia, and civil society. LEAD Pakistan also undertakes policy research and dialogue and outreach initiatives designed to promote synergy among the different stakeholders in national development.

A pool of more than 2,200 Fellows and Associates endows LEAD with outreach and expertise beyond the scope of a single organization. The network serves as our major pool of resource persons. The Fellows contribute as resource persons, trainers and host field visitors for LEAD Pakistan and can be mobilized from time to time.

The organisation operates a fully equipped office in Islamabad and is registered under the Societies Registration Act XXI, 1880.

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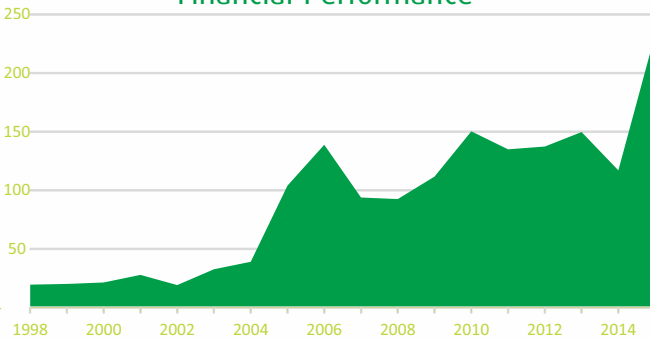

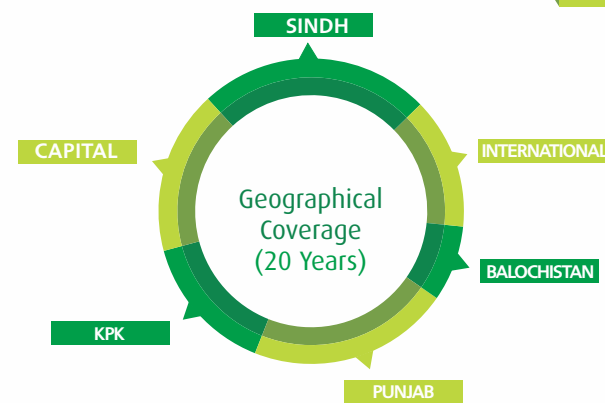
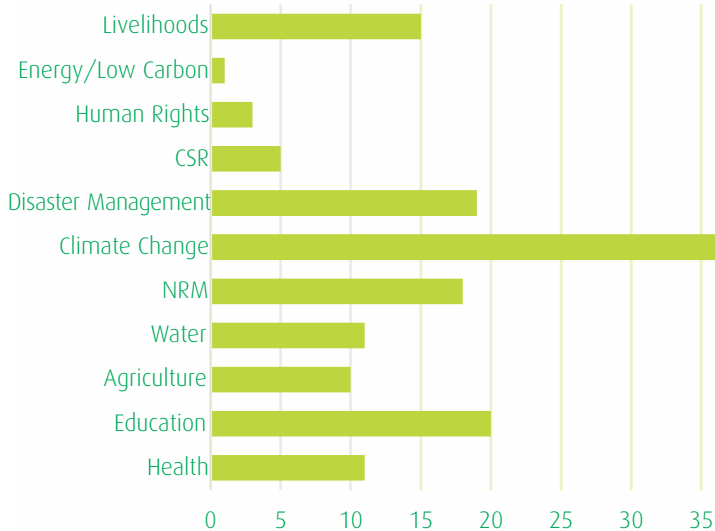

Our mission is to create, strengthen and support networks of people and institutions. These networks are then used to promote change towards development that is economically sound, environmentally responsible and socially equitable.



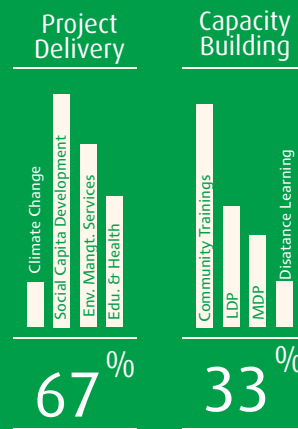
Sectoral Focus (20 Years)



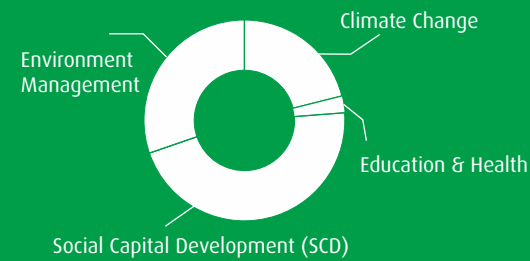
2000-2010

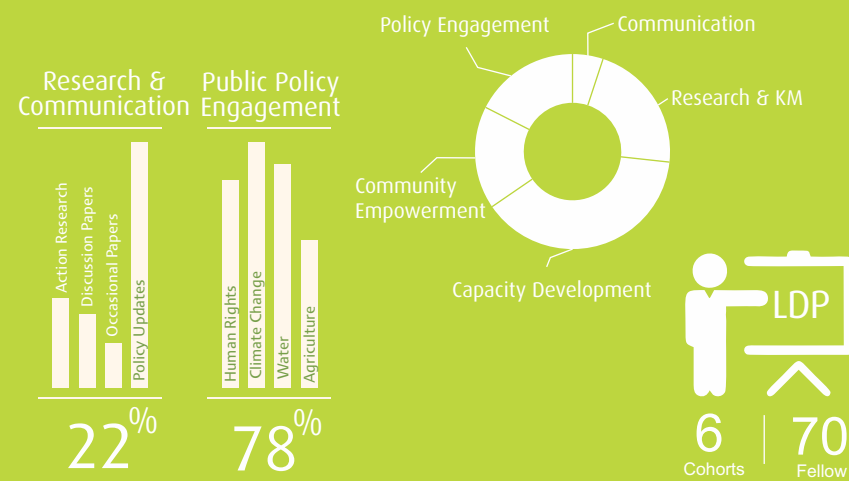

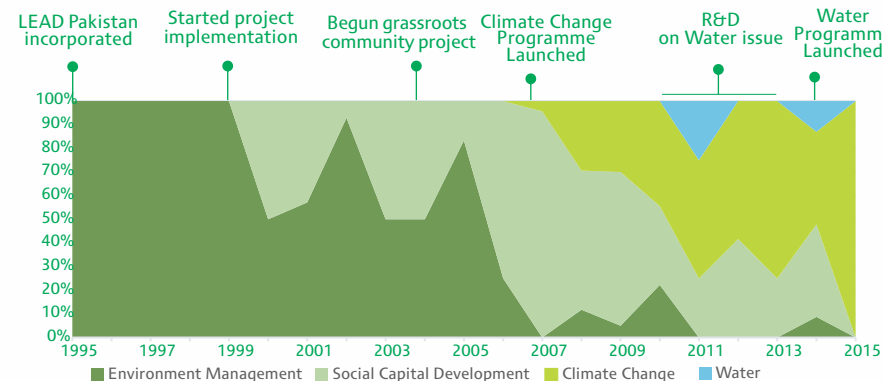
Programatic Focus
